Music and arts course menu

In addition to our general community regeneration and development work, **The Beat Project** specialises in the creative arts, music, film, media and technology which we use to engage and provide an exciting and unique framework for a programme which also includes personal, social and skills development and embedded basic and IT skills if required.

Rock & Pop

This activity includes playing live instruments including drums, guitar, bass, keyboards and percussion.

It also can include singing, song writing, music technology and recording and forming a band.

DJ Mixing courses

This activity includes learning to mix and scratch and record your own demos.

Music Technology

This includes using all the latest music software to create professional sounding songs. Participants will gain a great deal of general IT skills through this activity.

Finished products are recorded onto CD and participants can create their own labels.



DJ & Music Technology

This activity combines the two musical genres to create new and original sounds. Participants will also learn about sound engineering as well as composing pieces of music.

Singing & Movement

These activities can be split into a singing or movement (dance) project, but work really well together as well. Participants will learn all aspects of dance and singing styles and gain the opportunity to create and record their own pieces.

Urban Arts (Break dancing, Rapping, MC, DJ, Music Tech, Graffiti, Urban drumming).

All the activities within Urban Arts can be run separately or together as part of a project.

Art and sculpture

This activity is run by one of the region's best artists / tutors and is inspirational to all participants. Subjects include traditional painting, mosaic work, sculpture and mural work.

Art and design

Computer software packages are used to create all manner of design work from personal logos to more complex graphic design work.

Multi-cultural projects

The Beat Project can offer activities such as African drumming and dance through its arts partner organisations, but can also mix subjects such as African drumming with almost any other form of music to create interesting and unique projects.

Cross musical genre projects

Classical music is often avoided by young people due to a misconception that it is too complicated. However the Beat Project is pleased to work with a brilliant young composer who is extremely talented and plays with chart topping bands as well as respected orchestras. She will work with another of our tutors to mix other musical styles such as DJ mixing and classical compositions together or create classical style pieces using other instruments such as drums or even voices.

Film and television Projects

The Beat Project specialises in running film projects.

Brilliant tutors, broadcast quality digital cameras and easy to use digital editing on computers and an unlimited imagination makes it very enjoyable to create films about any subject whether fictional, based on fact, educational, promotional or an evaluation film.

Music, professional graphics and animation can be incorporated into films to enable the participants to be even more creative and produce a professional finished product on DVD.

Radio projects

Radio projects can be used to create a participants very own session which is recorded onto CD. All aspects of radio are covered including setting up equipment and recording techniques. Radio projects are limited only by the imagination of the participant and all subjects can be tackled through for example a radio talk show.

Drama and theatre

The Beat Project works with some of the South East's leading drama and theatre tutors. All projects are fun and inspiring and incorporate professional warm ups and trust exercises. All manner of subjects can be covered and the tutors are extremely capable of dealing with sensitive issues.
